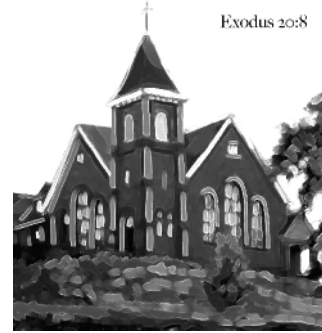

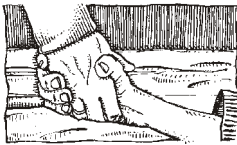

Preschool News

How quickly the first month of school passes! The preschoolers have been learning our routines and schedule. We start the morning with Circle Time, where we learn together by doing full group activities that focus on things like identifying shapes, patterns, colors and counting. We have some regular songs that we sing during that time, and we also check the calendar and the weather each day. After Circle Time, the children have time to choose their own activities in the room. We also usually complete a skills paper during that time or do our art project. Everyone likes snack time, which comes next. After we've cleaned up from snacks, we return upstairs for story time and Jesus time before finishing up our day outside with recess.

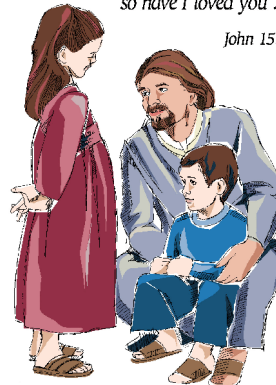
We've spent two weeks in September learning a lot about apples. The children really enjoyed the day that we were able to sample a slice of a green apple, a red apple and a yellow apple. The children then told me what kind was their favorite. Some of the preschoolers discovered they liked *all* the colors of apple! We finished September and started October by exploring the theme, "Welcome Fall." Our activities will center around squirrels, leaves, and other fall items. Later in October we'll talk about "Fire Prevention" and we'll finish up with "Pumpkins."

For Jesus Time, we have finished Creation and moved on to the account of Noah's Ark. We're learning that God takes care of us, just as He took care of Noah when the flood destroyed almost all the life on Earth. Jesus Time is a wonderful opportunity to share the truth of the Bible with little ones. I'll close with a song we sometimes sing to begin Jesus Time-"Have You Ever Met My Jesus?" (This follows the tune of "Have You Ever Seen a Lassie?")
